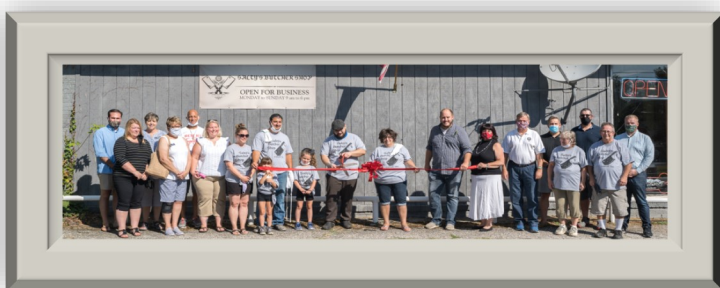
Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

Feed Our Vets Ashtabula, opened in September 2019. We have provided free food assistance to more than 1,416 Veterans and their family members, distributing 78,170 lbs. of food.

Feed Our Vets is a 501(c) 3 nonprofit organization whose mission is to help Veterans in the United States, their spouses and children whose circumstances have left them on the battlefield of hunger, and to involve the public in fighting Veteran hunger.

More than 130,000 Veterans are homeless and hungry on any given night in America. One in three homeless people in America is a U.S. Military Veteran. And nearly four million Veterans and their families don't have enough to eat during the year. Veterans have served and sacrificed for our freedom. Many are returning from war to a weak economy, and struggling with injuries, both physical and mental. Too many Veterans are ending up jobless and homeless. Too many are going hungry. We believe it is our duty to give back to these men and women who have given so much for our country.

Most of the food and groceries are purchased by Feed Our Vets, but we do rely on donations from the surrounding community. We do purchase food from Country Neighbor and Cleveland Food Bank. Feed Our Vets pantry distributes free food and groceries at regular, scheduled times which is every 3rd Saturday of the month from 8am to 12pm at 433 Center Street, Ashtabula. We have around 20 volunteers monthly who help in the pantry stock shelves and help the Veterans shop on the pantry day. We are like a "mini" grocery store, where the Veteran and their family are able to come in, shop feel at home and pick out what groceries are needed. Such as milk, eggs, meat, fresh veggies and fruits and non-perishable canned and boxed goods for the month. We strive to provide healthy food and at least three weeks of groceries for the families.
